As organizations focused on protecting the privacy of the American public, we express our strong support for the confirmation of Prof. Lina Khan as a commissioner for the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). Prof. Khan brings a critically important set of skills and knowledge that will ensure the FTC is best positioned to play a leadership role safeguarding U.S. consumers as they navigate the digital environment.

As you know, U.S. consumers face growing risks to their privacy, including data breaches, unfair methods of data collection, and the use of powerful—but little understood—technologies and techniques that continually monitor us online. Prof. Khan's knowledge of the operations of the online marketplace, including the role of the leading platforms, will help the commission more efficiently identify and address threats to privacy.
